Today's Activities

City of Pacific

CR met with the Algona/Pacific Library managers and they will distribute information to Spanish speaking people at the English as a Second Language (ESL) class. We returned to Oakhurst Drive and went door to door and distributed flyers to 17 homes and talked to 6 individuals. Flyers were left at the other 11 homes. 3 individuals applied for assistance, 1 claimed they were not affected and 1 person had not applied. One homeowner reported that the city inspector had inspected each home and is requiring that repairs be made. Another resident said that he had roof damages and he was reluctant to call his insurance company because he was afraid he would be cancelled. CR referred him to the State Insurance Commissioner Office for assistance. Damages reported appear to be limited to crawl spaces and foundations. Two residents indicated they had incurred respiratory problems since the flooding.

CR visited 9 homes on Butte Avenue South. 4 homes had red tags and 2 had yellow tags. We spoke with 5 residents. 1 resident claimed no damage. No one had applied for disaster assistance. CR distributed tel-reg and DRC flyers to each home and encouraged residents to register.

State CR followed up with the couple at the Meagan Court apartments to learn that their FEMA check arrived today and the wife received medical treatment. They were referred to the DRC to get assistance with their SBA loan application.

Maple Valley

CR met with the City EM who took us on a tour of the damaged areas. The extent of the flood damages was more extensive than the number of calls ins to King County had indicated. Damage appears to be dispersed in approximately 8-10 pockets of homes which appear to have minor to major damages throughout the area along the Cedar River near Hwy 169. CR visited six homes and spoke with 5 people in the area. No one had applied for disaster assistance, but one person indicated

they were thinking about it. He had heard from a neighbor that only SBA loans were available at 8%. CR explained that aid was made on a case by case basis and encouraged the person to go to the DRC or call the application line to receive accurate information. Another person indicated that they had not applied for disaster assistance because he had heard that if you received FEMA assistance, there would be a notation in their property description, which would then devalue their property. CR provided him with telereg/DRC flyers and referred him to the DRC for more information. We went to the Cedar Grove mobile home park where 30-40 mobile homes have damages. We spoke to 2 of the residents who both had damages, but neither had applied for aid. CR provided the tel/reg and DRC flyers and encouraged them to register. This is the mobile home park that is under the county "buyout". The resident population is primarily Hispanic.

Per the EM, the Maple Valley Reporter and the Covington Reporter weeklies are under the same roof and are the best source of information for the community. Heads Up PIO.

EM inquires about the snow declaration and when the PA applicant briefing will be held. A contact to the EM would be appreciated.

Plan for Tomorrow (Future)

CR plans to return to Maple Valley to conduct outreach at the Cedar Grove mobile home park and make contact with the Chamber of Commerce director.

Today's Activities

CR Team is canvassing affected areas:

- Encouraging individuals to register
- Explaining FEMA, SBA and other disaster assistance programs
- Distributing Tele-registration flyers in English and Spanish
- Introducing community leaders to the CR mission and FEMA, State and other disaster assistance programs; requesting their assistance in reaching out to affected residents and business owners

Town of Calumet

CR visited 1 major employer (2nd largest in county, with 100 employees on average, though only 20 were employed at time of incident). Spoke with staff, who stated no physical damage and no employees reporting residential damage; economic impact to company unknown.

CR visited County Health and Human Services, and met with Outreach Coordinator, who stated she knew of 7 people with damage; registration unknown. The office serves the entire county; disaster information will be made available. CR also met with Operations Manager who stated he would like information regarding FEMA's role in Long-Term Recovery.

CR visited Library and spoke with director, who stated the facility serves 300 families on a regular basis. Director stated disaster information will be made available, as well as internet access.

CR visited County Health Department and spoke with staff, who stated no employees affected. Disaster information will be made available to clients.

CR visited Chamber of Commerce and spoke with staff, who stated 250 member businesses; 3 report physical damage; economic injury uncertain; loss of work uncertain. Many businesses are based out of people's homes.

CR visited 2 schools, and met with principals, who stated superintendent on vacation. The district is the only one in the county, covering most students residing in Skamokawa and to the east. High school principal stated 170 students, 30 faculty and staff. Disaster assistance information will be distributed in a daily bulletin and posted at the school. No staff or students known to be affected.

Elementary principal stated 320 students attend K-8 school, with 40 faculty and staff. Large number of student families affected, but no faculty or staff. 5 Russian families voluntarily evacuated and residences probably affected; family reported to have English-speaking ability. Principal stated some Spanish-speaking families; damage unknown. CR discussed documentation issues.

CR visited 17 residences in area reported affected by County EM; 9 contacts; 2 damaged; 1 insured for flood; 0 registered; both will register. 1 home currently uninhabitable; resident staying with family. 1 resident is underinsured and has flood damage 3 years in a row. Resident enquired regarding mitigation measures; CR discussed ICC and referred to DRC.

Today's Activities

City of Tacoma

State and FEMA CR Team canvassed River Road area, a total of 20 residences, 19 not home, 25 had visible damage, and 3 registered with FEMA. Some of the residents inquired if there was going to be a buyout of their properties, residents were referred to the County Emergency Management. Two agricultural businesses which sustained damages were referred to the Farm Services Bureau for possible assistance. CR Team distributed disaster information including DRC Locations and provided an overview of the application process. Non registered residents were encouraged to register for possible FEMA disaster assistance.

CR Team met with the manager of the Tacoma Country Estates and provided an overview of the application process. Manager stated will distribute disaster information to the 87 residents of the mobile home park. Manager stated that damage to the homes in the mobile home park was minimal, although damage to the sewer and draining system was sustained. Manager was provided information regarding SBA assistance, manager stated will forward information to the owners of the park

City of Sumner

State and FEMA CR Team did a blitz at Rainier Mobile Home Park, the entire mobile home park sustained flood damage. A total of 47 mobile homes were canvassed, 25 residents contacted, 57 mobile homes with visible damage, 17 were registered. Some of the residents were appreciative of the expedient process for registration and inspection of their properties. In the vicinity of the Mobile Home Park, the CR Team canvassed four additional homes, and eight apartments, eight not home. CR Team clarified the registration process and encouraged the resident to register for possible assistance.

CR Team met with the manager of a large apartment complex next to the mobile home park, the manager will distribute disaster assistance information to 38 displaced residents.

CR Team distributed disaster assistance material to the Communications Director of the City of Sumner, she stated will distribute information to the City Hall Staff.

CR Team distributed disaster assistance material to two businesses for public distribution.

Today's Activities

City of Stanwood

CR Team visited the city hall, the police station, the chamber of commerce, the fire department, the public works department and two businesses in the city of Stanwood. The city clerk, the fire captain and the public works director identified specific areas of damage and provided supporting documentation. The area identified is located south of Highway 532. CR Team explained the FEMA process and provided FEMA disaster materials for distribution to affected residents. The Chamber of Commerce has 150 members. The chamber sent emails to all members and to an additional 100 individuals in response to the city's request to inform residents of current disaster information. The city hall and the chamber of commerce are posting the FEMA disaster materials on their bulletin boards and their websites.

City of Darrington

CR Team visited the city hall, the library, the fire department, the school administrative office, the elementary school, the middle/high school, the community center, the post office and one business in the city of Darrington. The fire chief advised that the damage in the city is sporadic and occurred mostly to secondary structures. The fire chief identified Swede Heaven, 310th Street, 311th Street and 370th Street as areas where damage occurred. The fire chief advised that the mill lost several buildings as a result of the storms. The city clerk advised that they are not aware of any damage in the city. The school administrative office

advised the CR Team to visit the local schools to have FEMA disaster material posted and distributed. The middle/high school stated that they would post flyers throughout the school and would post the FEMA disaster materials on their website. The elementary school advised that they would post the flyer and also include FEMA disaster registration information in the newsletter. The elementary school has 233 students and the middle/high school has 234 students. The library, community center, post office and business all posted the FEMA disaster materials on their bulletin boards. CR Team explained the FEMA process and provided FEMA disaster materials for distribution.

Today's Activities

North Bend

CR visited 21 homes in a pocket neighborhood just west of the South Fork Snoqualmie River. Streets canvassed were 413th, 415th, and 123rd. CR spoke with 15 residents, 9 of which report damages, none had applied. All had insurance. Issues voiced to CR were: Angry at insurance companies for late response, changing their category of risk, and raising rates. Frustration with county due to Mitigation grants for raising structures are for some but not others. Flood damage appears to be minor to major. At least 4 residents are living in trailers on their properties while home repairs are underway. Residents report that this neighborhood has been flooded many times in the past and while this is upsetting, they report that their experiences with FEMA have been good. Two residents reported that they heard that the DRC was closing FEB 7th and thought this meant that this was also the final filing date. They also thought that they had to wait for their insurance settlement before they could apply to FEMA. CR provided Tel-Reg and DRC fliers and encouraged those who had not applied to do so. CR also explained the application and inspection process and informed residents that they did not have to wait for their insurance settlements to apply.

CR visited 4 churches and 1 library and distributed printed materials. CR encouraged clergy to make announcements at services.

Snoqualmie

CR visited 7 churches and provided both Tel-Reg and DRC fliers for distribution at Sunday services. CR also requested clergy to make announcements if possible which most were very glad to do. One church reported that 10 out of their 150 congregation members had suffered major damage and others reported minor damage. Another church reported that 4 of their 85 members had suffered major damage to their homes and they will make sure that these families receive our information.

CR visited 5 businesses and posted both Tel-Reg and DRC fliers. One business, a local fitness center informed CR that several of their members were affected and they were very glad to receive our materials and posted on their front door.

CR visited the Encompass Children's, Family, and Community Center where printed materials were left for distribution to affected members. CR also posted fliers on their Reader Board.

CR provided tele-registration fliers and encouraged applicants who had damage to apply with FEMA.

Today's Activities

City of Snohomish

CR Team accompanied the Snohomish County Emergency Management Office with their "Community Disaster Clean-up" at the Stocker's Soccer Field. Fifty individuals volunteered to assist residents affected by the disaster with debris removal. Volunteers visited homes on Pine Ave and Sexton Rd that had requested assistance to remove debris located outside the homes. CR Team performed outreach to 30 residences located on Pine Ave and Sexton Rd. Of the 30 residences visited, 16 face to face contacts were made, with 13 reporting damage, five had insurance and one had registered. The residents were very receptive of the FEMA disaster materials. CR Team explained the FEMA process, distributed FEMA disaster materials and encouraged residents to register for assistance, as well as to visit the local DRC.

One resident assumed that he had registered with FEMA for assistance when he contacted the county. CR Team explained the FEMA process and encouraged the resident to register for assistance.

One resident was upset that the county is not taking steps to prevent further flooding along Sexton Rd. The resident advised that the river has been prevented from flowing naturally as a result of the city allowing the construction of homes in the area. CR Team will forward the resident's complaint to the county emergency management office.

CR Team accompanied PIO and the KOMO News in the Three Rivers Mobile RV Park. CR Team revisited 38 residences and spoke with 28 residents. Of the 28 face to face contacts, two had insurance, 26 had damage, 14 had registered and 10 had been inspected. Many residents in the park speak only Spanish. The majority of the residents have registered and their homes have been inspected. The residents were appreciative of the follow-up visits and the quick response from

FEMA. One resident had concerns about registering by cell phone because it takes too long, so CR referred him to the DRC. Residents are concerned about mitigation and preventing future flooding or moving to another location. One resident has a badly damaged home and landlord problems, CR advised her to register and ask about housing assistance, plus CR will follow up with information about resources for the landlord issue. CR Team answered residents' questions about the FEMA process and referred residents to the Monroe Disaster Recovery Center for additional assistance. CR Team explained the FEMA process and provided FEMA disaster materials to all residents who have not registered for assistance.

Three residents may need temporary housing due to the severity of the damage to their home. CR Team advised the residents to visit the Monroe Disaster Recovery Center to register and to inform IA of their housing needs. CR Team explained the FEMA process and provided the residents with FEMA disaster materials. CR Team observed many badly damaged homes so more housing assistance may be necessary. One resident reported overflowing septic systems during the flooding.

One resident assumed that she had registered with FEMA for assistance when she contacted the county. CR Team explained the FEMA process and encouraged the resident to register for assistance.

City of Monroe

CR Team visited the Monroe DRC and spoke with the DRC manager. The DRC had a total of 11 visits on 02/06/2009. CR Team assisted the DRC with translation for one Hispanic family with registration problems. CR Team explained to the family what documentation is needed to correct the registration problems.

CR Team visited two businesses in the city of Monroe that reported no damage. CR Team explained the FEMA process and provided FEMA disaster materials to be posted in the businesses. The businesses expressed appreciation of FEMA's support in the county.

City of Maltby

CR Team visited one high traffic business in the city of Maltby. The business did not sustain any damage and was eager to post FEMA disaster materials. CR Team explained the FEMA process and provided FEMA disaster materials to be posted in the business. The business was appreciative of FEMA's support in the county.

City of Arlington

CR Team visited 11 residences in the city of Arlington. Of the 11 residences visited, eight face to face contacts were made, with five reporting damage, three had insurance, two had been inspected and three were registered. CR Team explained the FEMA process and provided FEMA disaster materials for all residents. One resident thought she had registered because she had contacted the county, CR explained that she must contact FEMA directly and explained the registration process.

Residents reported that the river did not overflow as in 2006 but the pond located behind their homes overflowed. The residents stated that the county added a culvert at the top of the hill/road which has caused much more water to flow down the hill into the pond and overflow onto their properties. One resident stated that the county is scheduled to redirect the flow of water from the culvert into the river during the summer. CR Team explained the FEMA process, provided FEMA disaster materials for all residents and encouraged residents to register for assistance.

regarding 'buy out program'; CR referred to county EM. 1 resident without damage was very happy with FEMA because they had been able to use funds from last year to buy a used trailer and raise it 4'; their previous residence was heavily damaged again. Residents glad to see FEMA, but mentioned strong anti-government sentiments in the area.

Community of Rosburg

CR visited 11 residences scattered throughout a large rural area to the SW; 4 contacts; 2 damaged; 2 on county list of reported damage; 1 insured; 0 registered; 1 stated they will register. 1 resident on Mill Rd has flooded 3 times in 3 years, is insured, reported damage to the county, but most likely will not register due to minimal damage.

Today's Activities

Benton City

FEMA/State CR did outreach in the town of Benton City, visiting both of the 2 residents and the single business listed on the EM's damage assessment list. Tele-registration flyers were left at two homes, and FEMA/SBA information was left with the manager of the business—Bridge Trailer Park directly on the river.

CR met with the mayor of Benton City who stated that Benton City has a population of 2,900, 71.9% of whom are Caucasian, 26% Hispanic, and the remainder being micro-percentages of Asian, Black, and Native American/Pacific Islander.

Concerning the flooding of Jan. 6-16, the mayor stated that a small amount of floodwater entered the sewer system and Bridge Trailer Park was without sewer service for one day. The water system was never compromised by flooding. When asked about the percentage of the population affected by flood, the mayor said he didn't know, but thought that "most damage was minor."

The mayor's concern for the future is that the present NFIP flood map is not as accurate as it should be, and that he would like to see it redrawn. FEMA/State CR suggested that the mayor meet with his Benton County EM and other county officials about where it should be redrawn, and then present their information to FEMA/NFIP.

CR left tele-registration flyers with the staff of City Hall, the Chamber of Commerce, 3 businesses, and 3 churches. "Dear Pastor" letters were also left at the churches.

Prosser

FEMA/State CR met with the Executive director of the Prosser Chamber of Commerce. Prosser is the county seat of Benton County, but had no flood damage in the immediate area. CofC director took a tele-registration flyer and said he would scan it into his bi-weekly eNews column that serves a list of 900 people.

In the Benton County Courthouse, flyers were left in two offices: Public Works Department and the Sheriff's Department. In addition, at the Sheriff's Office, CR introduced themselves and told the secretary that CR would be working in the county.

Old Empire Highway

FEMA/State CR drove the old river road from Prosser to Richland looking for possible unreported damage along the Yakima river. None was found.

West Richland

CR left flyers at the West Richland Chamber of Commerce and found out that they had already been contacted by the Olympia JFO. The chamber had already sent out the tele-registration flyer electronically to their 162 member list-serve. They were happy to have paper flyers.

FEMA/State CR visited 13 residences from the County EM's list of 38. CR talked to 4 of those residents, and left flyers only at 9 houses. Four have insurance, and 0 have applied to FEMA. In addition to working from the EM's list, tele-registration flyers were left at 12 other riverside residences in the neighborhood. CR had 4 face to face contact with non-list residents.

City of Kelso

CR followed up on the damaged apartment building (with 13 displaced, mostly Spanish-speaking, households) by meeting the Apartment's Resident Services Coordinator at the DRC. DRC Manager and State representative was present at the meeting. Coordinator is bilingual, and is in close contact with families. He stated each household includes about 6 individuals, making a total of 80 affected residents. 10 families are currently in a hotel, with rooms paid for by the Archdiocese; the rest are with relatives. Coordinator stated he will assist households with registering by phone today. CR provided contact information in case issues arise, and will follow up. DRC Manager encouraged visits by all households, and

were provided for all households.

Catholic Community Services Program Coordinator, who is involved in gathering household necessities on behalf of the families, was also present at the meeting. CR referred questions regarding the role her program might take to DRC Manager, and to County EMD, who is trying to gather support for a local Long-Term Recovery Committee.

IGA: CR met with Mayor and City Manager. CR discussed FEMA, State and other disaster assistance programs, sequence of delivery and CR mission. Mayor was very interested learn about all programs, and stated the city would do all it could to encourage registration and visits to DRC with questions and issues. Mayor stated he was very happy with FEMA response so far. Mayor is part-time and volunteer. As a CPA, he has already fielded questions from affected clients regarding tax issues. CR provided IRS Disaster Loss Kits for individuals and businesses, and discussed DRC as a resource to the community for all disaster-related questions and issues.

CR visited 4 residences; 4 contacts; 3 damaged; 3 registered; 1 insured. 2 residences can only be accessed by private bridge, which was destroyed. No immediate needs reported.

Special Needs: 1 resident is the owner of the bridge. She is 80 years old, legally blind, and has impaired mobility. Home is ¼ mile from bridge, which is impassable by vehicle; no other roads exist. Son is involved in care, grocery shopping, etc. Resident is registered, her son has visited DRC, and FEMA inspection was completed this afternoon. CR has filled out and turned in Special Needs Referral.

Private Sector: CR visited 1 business with a very visible reader board on Allen St. Owner agreed to display disaster information. No staff or clients reporting damage.

CR visited 4 churches and spoke with staff at 2. 230 total members; 1 damaged; registration status unknown. Disaster information will be made available to members.

CR contacted County EM Office and followed up with Assistant. No new issues. CR is scheduled to meet with volunteers Tuesday, and has suggested DRC Manager brief volunteers on their message prior to outreach. DRC Manager stated she will be available.

Issaquah

CERT teams went door to door to flood damaged properties and delivered flyers with FEMA disaster information including the telephone number. They also did a direct mailing to repetitive loss properties with the same information.

Officials indicated that 30 homes and 15 businesses had experienced flood damages. They said that some of these were low income residences and apartments and CR will follow up with visits to the areas.

They have utilized their community radio and T.V. station, as well as their website to inform citizens of disaster relief information. The city PIO will be putting FEMA disaster assistance information in all of these medias.

CR was informed that the primary flood damages were to businesses on Gilman Boulevard and that some employees were out of work for at least 3 weeks. CR will follow up with visits to these businesses.

Fall City

CR met with the EM who provided a detail description of the homes and businesses that were affected by the flooding. According to the EM, the businesses affected include a restaurant, a dairy farm, a tree farm, a kennel, 3 golf courses and a private owned campground. Homes are primarily located along the Fall City/Snoqualmie road near the Snoqualmie River. The EM also uses an internet "news group" that he will use to notify the community of FEMA disaster assistance information.

CR provided printed materials and explained the application process. The EM has worked for the Fire Department for 28 years and will contact each of the affected citizens and encourage them to register. CR will also follow up with visits.

CR visited a local restaurant and talked to the owner who has previously been flooded and he expressed frustration with the lack of assistance. He stated that he will not be registering this time. According to sources, a local logging/timber company has been escorting the families up a back road which is not considered safe for travel during the week. The road remains closed on weekends. However, there is one family that team was told of that refuses to leave their property, fearing that the timber company or the county would not allow them to return if the property is vacant.

State/FEMA CR team left Disaster Recovery Information at 9 homes around the city. CR team also spoke with a family that had registered, been inspected and received a check all within a four (4) day period. They were pleased with FEMA's response time and thought they were well taken care of.

State/FEMA CR team also spoke with a local LDS Bishop who says that there is a family wanting to donate 320 square feet of flooring to a deserving family.

No facilities damaged. 1 staff is known to be affected; registration status unknown. Unknown number of students affected. Disaster information will be put in weekly employee bulletin, on web site, and on the reader boards of up to 10 schools, pending principal approvals. Manager stated a large number of Spanish-speaking students attend 2 elementary schools; CR will follow up to assess damage in these areas and possible need for multi-lingual outreach.

CR visited Library and met with librarian, who stated 5,000 people use the facility each week. Disaster information will be made available to patrons.

Multi-lingual: CR also met with Library Adult Literacy Coordinator, who coordinates language classes for 150 foreign-born residents. Special Report Justin Lane City of Morton

The city clerk gave the following information;

-
- 1) There was a bridge over **Conley Creek** that the **Justin Lane** home owners wanted to use but it was destroyed in the flooding in 2007. The city is planning to rebuild the bridge and a county commissioner wants the residents to be allowed to use that bridge and a road that goes through the city watershed temporarily. The problem is that it goes through the watershed area and the Lewis County Health Department will not allow any road in the area based on the "Protection Plan" the city has for their watershed. This bridge will be a private bridge used by the city only to maintain the watershed area.
 - 2) Murray-Pacific Timber Company owns the destroyed bridge and says it is not economically feasible for them to rebuild it.
 - 3) The current location of the bridge is not a good place to rebuild as there are three different tributaries of the Tilton River converging at that location. A much better site would be about a ¼ mile north closer to the gated logging road owned by the timber company.
 - 4) These homes were originally zoned to be recreational sites only. Later, county permits were given to make them permanent home sites and there are several \$200K to \$300K homes located there. The residents have children in local schools and this area is like any other residential area.
-

The LDS Bishop gave the following information;

- 5) One couple (retired) would not leave their home even when power and phones were out. The power and phones are back online but they are afraid to vacate the property for fear of the Timber Company and /or county taking their property. (?)
- 6) The family that lost their home to the slide moved as much of the small stuff out of their home and just need to go back for the large items appliances, beds, televisions and other items such as that. There is a road the timber company allowed them to use to get their vehicles out but the company is balking about letting them use the road again as it is unstable and they are concerned that continued driving over it could cause it to slide off the ridge above and behind **Justin Lane**. (liability)
- 7) A timber company employee (forest ranger?) will open the gate on the road that goes through the timber company's property during the week and escorts homeowners through the timber company's property. This does not occur on the weekends.
- 8) There is another road that climbs up over the mountain but its elevation goes up to 2000+ feet in elevation. There is a concern if there are 3ft of snow in Morton there would be 6+ft at the summit. (there is some confusion on this road. We were told that one of the people drove his Honda over it and others say a SUV is needed to make the trip).

What we know;

9) There are 9 sites.

10) 2 of the 9 are recreational homes.

11) 1 of the remaining 7 was destroyed.

12) The PUD is issuing meter readers waders to get across the creek to read the meters. The PUD has no installations on the other side or in the ***Justin Lane*** area.

Today's Activities

CR visited 8 of the 86 homes listed on the county EM's list and two which were local referrals. From conversations it appeared that the December snow caused more damage than the flooding in the Marblemount area. There was also considerable bridge and road damage. Some residents were isolated for up to 8 days. Bi-lingual disaster fliers were left at all visited locations. All face to face contacts were also made aware of the Disaster Unemployment Assistance and the dead-line date.

CR concentrated efforts in the NE portion of the county on Highway 20, most of which is rural area. There was evidence of mud slides and road blockages all along the highway.

MARBLEMOUNT AREA

There was no cell service until Concrete.

Two of the home owners were registered and the inspectors had already been there. Businesses in the area are severely impacted by the economic loss due to the road closures. One couple who owned the restaurant/tavern and the motel had major roof damage and leakage and extensive costs to run the generators. When we suggested that he register with FEMA and the SBA, he said "he would think about it. He didn't want to get involved with a bunch of bureaucratic B.S."

CR was unable to locate the two homes on the EM list. The bridge and road were washed out on Conrad Road and we went in from both sides and could not locate the homes. We did however visit another home owner whose name was not on the list. When CR identified themselves, he said "Oh, I just called to find out information on how to get registered!" He was a happy camper (he also just happened to work at a campground.)

ROCKPORT AREA

Again, the CR team had difficulty locating the addresses on the EM list. We did one home not on the list that had damage, but had not registered. CR encouraged him to register with FEMA. Again, businesses mentioned the economic loss and the damages from the snow.

CONCRETE AREA

CR will come back to this area as there are 30 addresses on the EM list.

HAMILTON-LYMAN AREA

There were 4 addresses on the EM list in this area. CR could only locate one. The other individuals were not listed in the phone book. Will try to get more information when we return to this area.

They do not have e-mail at their home and can not view it daily.

When the weather is good they can apparently access their home via a poor DNR (Dept. of Natural Resources) road that 4 wheeled drive vehicles find challenging. They do not have a 4 wheeled drive vehicle. It adds 6 miles of gravel road to the trip. They can park on one side of the creek and walk (below knee high today) or use a log crossing that accesses a neighbors property.

Issaquah

CR visited 4 businesses from the County EM list. All 4 businesses are together in a low lying area near Issaquah Creek in Gilman Square. These businesses have a history of flooding; however, this time was the worst with up to 2 feet of flood waters inside damaging their inventory. Three of the businesses had insurance and one did not. None had applied as they do not want a loan. After a visit with CR, one business owner (a furniture dealer) stated that he will apply for an SBA loan now or at least check it out. CR visited 5 additional businesses who all also suffered damage but not nearly as much. One business (a KFC/Taco Bell Combo) stated that some of their employees lost up to two weeks work and really hurt them. CR provided FEMA printed materials to all businesses and informed them of available assistance including DUA.

CR contacted 3 residents from the County EM list and an additional 10 others nearby. Six of the residents had damage but none had applied. Reasons given for not applying were....1 They have insurance. 2. They didn't know they could apply. 3. Didn't think they'd get anything. CR encouraged all with damage to apply and let FEMA decide what they may qualify for. We were well received by all and thanked for our visit and efforts. CR was told several times today that they thought FEMA does a good job.

near Issaquah Creek. Resident was a renter and his apt took in 4" of flood water damaging flooring, walls and all of his personal property. Resident is still living in this apt and has no hot water or toilet facilities. The landlord is letting them use a bathroom upstairs for the time being but is not working well and the resident needs help. He informed CR that he didn't think he could apply to FEMA because he was a renter. CR informed him that he can absolutely apply and should do so right away. Resident stated he would call today.

One resident that had damage did not apply because he is not a citizen. He is however here lawfully, has a Green Card and after a call into the JFO to make sure he could apply, CR informed the resident who was very happy to hear this news. He will apply today.

CR also visited 8 additional businesses, 2 CBO's, and a Post Office where CR left FEMA printed materials for distribution.

TREND: A business owner who had flooded said the flooding is all because of efforts to save the Salmon and feels more efforts are in place to save the fish than there are to save residents. This has become a Trend as CR has heard this same complaint from many residents including at the Town Meeting in Carnation this past week.

She asked CR to check back in a few days. CR spoke with husband and daughter today. Husband stated they had about an inch of water in the house, but there was no damage. When CR inquired about wet insulation, he stated the house didn't have insulation. CR expressed concern regarding Mold or Mildew and its associated health risk, and he said he would check further and register if he found any. CR left another Registration flyer, a Flood Safe publication, and a Mold & Mildew pamphlet.

Sekiu: CR checked west of the Sekiu River along SR 113 for more homes that may have been flooded, none were found.

To date, CR has completed 101 contacts out of the 454 contacts on the King County EM list.

Seattle

Per request of Seattle EM, CR visited an apartment building that reported damages and an intersection where calls came in for water ponding during the flood event. Upon visiting the apartment house where there are three units, #'s 100, 200 and 300, CR learned that the apartments themselves did not receive damage but the hillside behind the apartment building had some slippage causing some access issues. While it was difficult to drive up the hill to the building, the residents were able to walk up the driveway to enter their apartments. A worker at the site informed CR also that the slide took place in December so this would not be a result of the flooding.

CR visited the named intersection of Aurora Avenue and 105th where we spoke with business owners that stated there was some ponding at the intersection during the flood event but no flood waters entered any of the businesses. CR provided FEMA printed materials for distribution in the event anyone felt they knew of someone who did get flooded as a result of the disaster. CR was thanked for the concern and personal visit.

Issaquah

CR met with the City EM at the site of the new DRC to provide him with DRC fliers for distribution. He stated he will send the information out to all on his distribution lists. CR also provided EM with an update on CR activities in the area and he is very pleased with our outreach to date.

Carnation

CR visited the library, 2 churches, Grocery store, City Hall, Bank, Chamber of Commerce, Laundry, Storage Facility and the Post Office to distribute the new DRC flier and encourage applicants to visit the center to meet one on one with the reps if needed. Today's Activities

State/FEMA CR team visited 11 more addresses on the State List today. CR team has visited 234 of the 252 addresses on the State List in Cowlitz County.

City of Longview

State/FEMA CR team visited 23 residences (11 on the State list) with Longview addresses. CR team spoke 10 residents, 21 residences have some kind of damage three are registered and have been inspected, one was in the process of registering online, and three had flood insurance. Residents reported water in basements, foundation damage, water flowing under and near the house, washed out driveways, damaged furnaces and ductwork, and an overflowing creek that threatened several driveways and access roads. CR team explained the FEMA process, provided FEMA disaster assistance information, and encouraged all unregistered, affected residents to register for assistance. Most of the unregistered residents said that they would register and thanked CR team for bringing the FEMA disaster assistance information. The remaining unregistered residents, as well as one or two who have been denied, have minor damage and will do the repairs themselves, usually to their driveway.

State/FEMA CR team met with the FEMA mitigation specialists in the Ace Hardware store in the Triangle Mall on Ocean Beach Highway. Mitigation will note the address of anyone who needs a CR visit. CR team referred many residents to the Mitigation Team for additional information today. CR team met with the SBA team in Longview to let them know we are available if they need CR assistance.

State/FEMA CR team met with staff at the Cowlitz County EM office to update on our progress. The EM staff had no additional addresses for CR to visit. The EM office is referring anyone with damages or questions to the FEMA registration/help line for assistance.

State/FEMA CR team drove out to affected homes along Mill Creek Road and observed several places where the road had slides and washouts. Two bridges have damage to the supporting ground and have warning signs on them for one lane use. Ten or 11 homes have access issues from driveway washouts that are in varying states of repair. One house has severe damage to the interior and the owner is living with relatives, CR team will follow up to locate her. A second house has no damage to the house but the pump house is damaged and is not covered by flood insurance according to the insurance company. A third house has damage to the retaining wall that protects the house from the creek.

Along Germany Creek Road, an upstream culvert filled with debris creating an earthen dam, which eventually burst and sent a wave of water down the creek bed that destroyed an old logging bridge and carried the debris downstream. The creek water left a lot of debris, took out stands of trees along the bank, and destroyed several retaining walls, yards, and gardens. Several homes lost sheds, barns, and garages from the storms.

The State list CR team has been working from is primarily residential addresses. There is also a list of 25 businesses, several of which are rental properties. Thirteen have been visited.

CR team met with an applicant who has had to do substantial repair work in order to prevent subsidence danger to her house from a slide in the nearby gully. The applicant is living on Social Security and does not qualify for an SBA loan, but has been denied assistance by FEMA because there is no damage to the house. The repair work is necessary to prevent damage to the house and she is now looking at a major bill and not enough income to cover it. CR team referred her to SBA to help with SBA paperwork and to mitigation for other possible assistance.

State/FEMA CR team met with the FEMA mitigation specialists in the Ace Hardware store in the Triangle Mall on Ocean Beach Highway. Mitigation registered one person from Castle Rock on the spot yesterday who said many of her neighbors have damage and are not registered. CR team will follow up with a visit to the neighborhood. CR team referred many residents to the Mitigation Team for additional information today. CR team met with the SBA team in Longview to let them know we are available if they need CR assistance.

CR team has visited all 252 of the 252 addresses on the EM residential list in Cowlitz County. CR team visited two businesses on the EM business list, so 22 of the 25 have been visited. Two of the remaining businesses are up the road towards Mt. St. Helens and we will visit them tomorrow or the following day, depending on the weather.

City of Kelso

relatively new and the owner put all his savings into it. The owner does not want an SBA loan because a VA loan would be a better rate.

State/FEMA CR team visited one business on the state list, a photography studio on Abernathy Creek Road that is also the owner's residence. The home and business have damage to part of the house/studio and to the driveway and has lost businesses. The owner thought he had registered with FEMA, but did not have a registration number. CR team explained the registration process, SBA, and DUA. The owner will register right away and pursue DUA and SBA.

State/FEMA CR team visited five of the eight addresses that were suggested by the appraiser's office and neighboring homes that CR has not previously visited. CR team spoke to six residents, four have damage, two have no damage, and three have registered. CR team answered any questions and advised residents about the SBA DLOC that is in Longview this week.

CR team did a follow up visit to a group of four homes along Abernathy Creek Road that were damaged and also lost access when debris coming down the creek caused one end of the bridge to fall into the creek. The bridge has been temporarily raised but the supports at one end washed away and the bridge is no longer safe for vehicles, so several residents have vehicles stranded on the other side of the creek. The residents who registered have received FEMA grants to repair the damage to their homes. The applicants have been calling the FEMA help line and been told that FEMA is still working on the bridge problem. FEMA CR recommended that the applicants notify the other residents who no longer have access to register for assistance and to continue calling the FEMA help line.

Renton

- CR met with King County EM to close out and perform maintenance exit interview. CR provided a detailed verbal review of CR activities and findings for all towns visited throughout the county. EM had the following concerns and comments:
- EM stated emphatically that there is a need for CR to attend the PA Applicant Briefings. Reasons given were to provide presence and partnership, support local efforts and recovery, and to field IA questions.
- EM stated that he would like to have met with the Multi-Lingual team so he could have been briefed on their mission and could have provided the team with the extensive contacts that are already established for the diverse and vulnerable populations. He further stated that if the Multi-Lingual Team is going to continue to work in King County, he would like to meet with them. Providing educational, accurate and time sensitive disaster related information is high priority to King County Officials for these populations. This is to not only aid in the immediate disaster, but to build trust and confidence in the process of emergency assistance. As an example of the need for this, there were areas identified on the PDA's hard hit with damage but without call-ins to the county.
- EM informed CR that he would like to see County run Disaster Assistance Centers for future events where more local agencies would be represented and FEMA and SBA would be invited to house along with them.

Seattle

- CR met with Seattle City EM and EM Coordinator to provide a close-out maintenance interview. CR team briefed on CR activities and findings to date. Questions and concerns raised at today's meeting were:
- They would like to have the Multi-Lingual team coordinate with them and their extensive Human Services Network.

- EM was surprised after reviewing the State's report on the Multi-Lingual Team's activities that so much attention was given based on such little damage. They also were surprised that team did not contact them for a list of contacts as they have 97 spoken languages in the Seattle Public School district and an extensive Human Services Network that they are more than willing to share.
- EM's also identified the growing importance of the Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) which includes the neighborhood Farmer's Markets, the Green and Buy-Local, and Organic Foods movements. In disasters, these groups sustain damages and losses where no State or Federal programs can help leaving them at the mercy of whatever privately funded programs can offer. There is a small amount of assistance available through the Good Farmer Fund through the Neighborhood Farmer's Market Alliance.

Pike Place Market

- Per EM request, CR contacted the Farm Program Manager who informed CR that there are 85 farmers in the farm program, 35 to 40 are ethnic flower growers, 80% of those are Hmong, (and others are Hispanic & Phillipino). Their fields extend from the Snoqualmie River Valley to the Auburn Valley and north to Edmonds. The repetitive flooding, financial losses, and family attrition are threatening the farm program at Pike Place Market. The Farmer's Relief Fund is available through the Market Foundation. This privately funded assistance usually helps with only up to 5% of their losses. CR reported these findings to the EM.
